

# The Bermuda Run Garden Club: Making a Difference in the Community

Gather up those old files, canceled checks and outdated documents. The Bermuda Run Garden Club has plans to help you securely dispose of all that unwanted paper. The garden club will sponsor its fourth semi-annual shredding event April 16. This is a drive-through process where the paper is shredded on site. As in previous years, the shredding will take place in the Bermuda Run Town Hall parking area just off Highway 158 at 120 Kinderton Boulevard. The shredding will take place on Saturday, April 16, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., rain or shine.

Bermuda Run Garden Club members will collect \$5 per brown grocery bag of paper or equivalent size box. In the shred container, do NOT include carbon paper, cardboard, plastics, transparencies, napkins or cups, drink cans, or paper plates. Also, no electronic material like CDs or fiche can be accepted for shredding. These are cash only transactions.

All proceeds from this event go to Davie County community projects. The garden club uses the proceeds to support Storehouse for Jesus, Davie Meals on Wheels, Pearls of Empowerment, Exceptional Children of Davie County, the Davie County Library, the Children's Reading Program Summer Camp and more. The garden club gave \$1000 last year from this fundraiser to the Davie Community Foundation in support of the summer reading camp program.

The Bermuda Run Garden Club helped start the recycling program in Davie County. This shredding event helps continue the recycling effort.

The COR365 shredding truck will be in the Bermuda Run Town Hall parking area off Highway 158 on Saturday, April 16, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. For more information on the shredding event, contact Marie at 336-650-5518.
